The Bachelor of Business in Management Information Systems (MIS) program is based on a national model curriculum developed by educators and computer professionals, which is endorsed by the Association for Computing Machinery, the Association for Information Systems, and is adopted by leading universities across the nation.

About the Program

The BBA in MIS Program, which is accredited by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business-International (AACSB-International), is a 120-hour-credit program comprised of 42 hours of Common Core Requirements; 48 hours of Business Core Requirements; 21 hours of MIS Major Requirements and 9 hours of Upper-Level Electives.

The curriculum is designed to prepare students to enter the workforce with knowledge and skills in:
